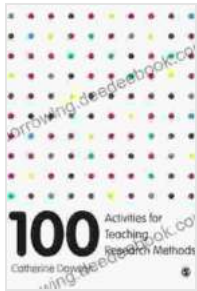
9. Activity: Research Methods Simulation
