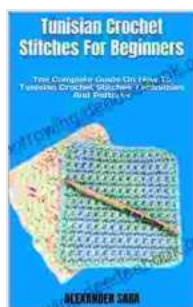

- Tunisian crochet hook
- Yarn

- Scissors
- Tapestry needle

The two basic Tunisian crochet stitches are the simple stitch and the double stitch.

To make a simple stitch, insert the hook into the next stitch on the row and pull up a loop. Yarn over and pull through both loops on the hook.

### **Double stitch:**

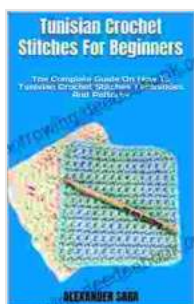
